## IS-BAO – More Than an SMS

In 2002, the International Business Aviation Council (IBAC) introduced the IS-BAO Program to provide a safety framework to support operators and later incorporated a practical Safety Management System (SMS) application. Today, IS-BAO is more than an SMS, it is an integrated business

and risk management tool for the entire organization.

Uniquely positioned as a non-profit, international trade association. IBAC has observer status at the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and represents the industry through its member associations - including NBAA - to ensure global aviation standards developed at ICAO reflect business aviation needs. IS-BAO is governed by a Standards Board of industry professionals as is its sister program, the International Standard for Business Aircraft Handling (IS-BAH) introduced in 2014. IS-BAH also offers Fixed Based Operators (FBO) and Business Aircraft Handling Agents (BAHA) an industry-developed code of best practices and is scalable to any size organization. Working in unison, the two standards' core foundation is based on delivering quality programs that are created FOR the industry. BY the industry, and are equal partners in safety.

Implementing the IS-BAO Program may sound complicated, but we break it down into six steps, and if you need assistance, we have gualified Program Support Affiliates (PSA) available to support you every step of the way. Most operators already have many IS-BAO processes in use but may not have them documented or have compared them with a global standard. IS-BAO provides a framework to help you.

IS-BAO continues to evolve with the industry and provide more benefits to operators. Due to IBAC's work at ICAO and with authorities around the world, IS-BAO registration may facilitate credit toward compliance with certain States' standards or is recognized as an alternate means of compliance. Furthermore, IBAC is engaged with EASA and some European national authorities regarding credit for IS-BAO-registered operators in the context of the Safety Assessment of Foreign Aircraft (SAFA) ramp inspection program.

Another initiative that is currently in beta testing is our new advanced Progressive Stage 3 option for IS-BAO operators that have a mature integrated SMS and want to continue the path of continuous improvement. The Progressive option includes a streamlined one-day annual audit and sharing of confidential safety data for industry benchmarking and to support other IS-BAO operators
